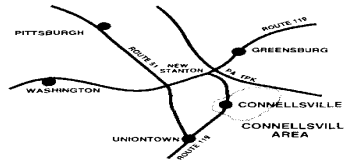

## SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP ELEMENTARY TITLE I PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY

1. Parents are extended an invitation to visit school throughout the school year. Meetings and conferences with parents are scheduled according District Policy. Conferences and meetings can be scheduled at the convenience to the parent before school, after school or during school, in accordance with the teacher's planning and preparation time.
2. Parents are informed of their child's progress in the Title I Program four times a year through reports. Also, the parents have the opportunity to log onto a web based reporting system at any time to view their child's grades and attendance in real time.
3. The curriculum for Title I is based on proven practices. Students are expected to meet the proficiency level established under NCLB. Copies of assessments are sent to parents to provide assistance with understandable content and achievement standards.
4. Elementary school parents are invited to attend parent-teacher conferences to discuss their child's school progress. Conferences with the Title I Specialists are scheduled through the school office.
5. Parents of all students are invited to an annual meeting. During the meeting, time is allotted for parent questions and comments regarding the Title I Program. Also during this annual parent meeting the parents are informed of the requirements of the Title I Program and their right to be involved.
6. Parents are invited to attend parent workshop presented by the County Federal Program Coordinators Association during the school year. These workshops offer activities that parents may use in helping their children achieve school success. Title I funds are utilized to encourage parent involvement activities.

7. A Parent/School/Student Compact has been developed, reviewed and adopted by the Title I parents. These compacts outline the responsibilities the parent, the school, and the child have in achieving a successful educational experience. The compacts are discussed at each parent meeting. Copies of the Title I Parent Involvement Policy and compacts are sent to parents who do not attend the meeting. These documents are written in a format and language easily understood by the parent.
